Project #1Pr/Global Grant Project - We initially began the year intending on initiating a District Grant to support H2O for Life's work in providing clean water to a school in Africa. In talking to H2O for Life, we learned that the White Bear Lake Club was putting together a Global Grant for the area. Our club realized by dropping our District Grant and joining White Bear Lake with their Global Grant we could provide more funds with the same amount of effort due to RIF matching the grant.

Zappa is in Asaba, located in the terrace of the Niger River. The school has a population of 455 girls, 435 boys and 60 teachers. Zappa School currently has no water supply. Students are requested to carry water to school, but often students do not have an adequate source at home. The school has 4 pour flush toilets that are not functional and need to be replaced. There are no hand washing stations, and hygiene education program has not been implemented.

The project plan calls for construction of a borehole well with storage tank, rehabilitation of the current toilets to make them functional and construction of 4 additional toilet compartments for boys and girls with the addition of urinals for the boys. They also plan to build hand wash stations, implement hygiene training, and create hygiene school committees and parent groups to oversee maintenance and sustainability.

Ron Felt and Burt Riskedahl from the Sunrise Rotary Club made presentations at the LEAP school, Como Park High School and Central High School in St. Paul.

Furthermore, two more schools have pledged money, which, along with our commitment of \$1,000, will reach the goal of \$3,300 towards cleaning the water at the Zappa Junior Mixed school in Nigeria.

Project #2; Fast for Hope: In addition to the H2O for life project we are also involved with Fast for Hope. To date two of our club members have been on delegations to Nicaragua. One of our club meetings was devoted to a Fast for Hope presentation. Ed Marek regularly provides Fast for Hope presentations to clubs throughout the district.

Project #3 – Polio Plus: Our club exceeded our yearly giving goal by November 2017. We had a dedicated presentation about polio in November. For the month of October, we dedicated our happy dollars to the polio plus campaign.

In addition to the project in Nigeria, we will be doing a project for next year in Guatemala supporting a women's center providing training for employment and empowerment.

Polio Plus - We raised monies in the club through our Happy Dollars and donations from Rotarians to meet our goal. We also have updates on the progress eradicating polio.

Fast for Hope - In addition to raising funds from the membership for FFH, we have a speaker coming in to do a presentation on the Initiative.

Other- Two of our members have traveled to Nicaragua in past years and serve on the Fast for Hope's speaker's bureau presenting programs to other clubs throughout the District.
